The Ylang Ylang has the same qualities as its namesake, a flower that is used medicinally for its calming effects. The villa lies at the end of a lane off the Sanur-Klungkung highway, set back from the black sands of Saba Beach. From the timber sundeck at the property's edge, observe the meandering of the Petanu River as it enters Badung Strait, watched over by the peaks of Nusa Penida beyond.
